From Fr. Jared's Desk....

Dear Parishioners,

I want to formally invite each and every one of you to the ORDINATION TO THE PRIESTHOOD of the three young men who were ordained deacons here at St. Aloysius this past April. The three men are members of the Society of Jesus Christ the Priest, and will be ordained by Bishop Morlino on the 31st of July at 5:30 p.m. here at St. Aloysius. I invite you to show your support and encouragement for these soon-to-be priests.

The fact that they may be unknown to you is not truly a great concern. A priest is someone who has given his life over entirely to Jesus Christ to be a bridge between God and man. He brings grace and forgiveness of God to man, and offers sacrifices (most importantly the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass) to God on behalf of man. As the Letter to the Hebrews says, "Every high priest is taken from among human

beings and is appointed to act on their behalf in relationships with God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins; he can sympathize with those who are ignorant or who have gone astray, because he too is subject to the limitations of weakness. That is why he has to make sin offerings for himself as well as for the people. No one takes this honor on himself; it needs a call from God, as in Aaron's case."

So, whomever these men may be, wherever they may carry out their work, it is a beautiful act of gratitude for us to show our support as they will always intercede for us before God.

Let us keep them in our prayers, that they may be always faithful to their calling.

FAQ's Regarding St. Aloysius Middle School

How many potential students have been identified? Are there enough students to sustain a middle school?

Our discussions regarding the middle school are still in their initial phases. One of the next steps is to gauge community interest in a middle school. However, given the fact that we will not have the expense of teacher salaries, nor the expense of purchasing a building, or adding on to the existing school for more classroom space, it may be financially feasible to operate the school with only a few students.

Even if we have 60 students, we won't need to have 10 teachers. What will the other consecrated women do if they are not teaching in the middle school?

They would seek other employment and/or volunteer positions. This may include:

- working in some capacity at other parishes in the cluster
- working with students in after-school programs
- obtaining secular jobs outside of the schools and cluster parishes.

What is the proposed start date for the school?

The earliest start date would be September, 2009. The alternate start date would be September of 2010. Many details have yet to be determined. It remains to be seen whether all the necessary preparations can be completed between now and September. The start date will depend on whether or not all of the preparations can be completed, and on the approval of the school by Bishop Morlino.

"AFTER 6" CD RELEASE CONCERT

The CD is titled "Set Another Place at the Table" and includes a variety of contemporary Christian, praise and worship music. They will perform the entire CD.

SUMMER MOVIE NIGHTS

The ENDOW women's group is sponsoring movie nights, featuring films about saints, on June 29, July 20, and August 17 in the Youth Center starting at 6:30 PM.

June 29 - EWTN's docu-drama on **Edith Stein** (Teresa Benedicta of the Cross), a Carmelite beatified by Pope John Paul II. She was a Jewish convert and philosopher who was martyred in the death camp of Auschwitz. Most of Edith Stein's writing on women and women's vocation stems from the decade of her professional life between her conversion and her entrance into the Carmelite community at Cologne. The importance of these essays cannot be overestimated, both in terms of their originality and level of insight, but also in terms of their wider influence. On a recent visit to the U.S., Cardinal Lustiger of Paris, himself a Jewish convert to Catholicism, called Edith Stein one of the greatest philosophers of our time. "Her best pupil," he said, "is the Holy Father (John Paul II)." Anyone who has read his encyclical on *The Dignity and Vocation of Woman*, or his later *Letter to Women*, will see immediately how much they owe to Edith Stein's pioneering work on this subject.

July 20 - Ignatius Press's Saint **Therese of the Child Jesus**, called the "greatest saint of modern times." In 1997 she was declared a Doctor of the Church and her *Little Way of Spiritual Childhood* is an outline for the spiritual life that can be lived by anyone to achieve holiness. The film tells her story through interviews, dramatizations, examination of her writings, and visits to her homes.
